**Charge:** The committee represents to the chancellor and the University community the concerns of faculty and other users and creators of scholarly information. The committee's functions include:

- 1) monitoring trends in such areas as institutional or consortial copyright use policies, changes in copyright ownership models, and guidelines for fair use of information in all formats;
- 2) identifying areas in which policy development is needed and recommending to the chancellor new or revised institutional policies and guidelines;
- 3) cooperating with the administration to propose and monitor the application of University policies and guidelines regarding ownership and use of copyrighted or licensed scholarly works; and
- 4) assisting in identifying educational needs of the faculty and others related to compliance with copyright policies and guidelines, and advising on appropriate ways to address those needs.

**2007-2008 Activities:**

The committee undertook four main issues during this year. They were:

- **Further clarification of new commercialization policy**

Revisions to the copyright policy regarding the commercialization of works were approved by Faculty Council at its March 23, 2007 meeting.

The language was modified to provide better clarification in two areas. The clarifications were:

--Centers and institutes may want copyright ownership to remain with the institute or center, and not the principal investigator or author, to remain in keeping with their current practices.

--SPA employees cannot legally maintain a share of the royalties under state law. With royalties now being shared by the creators (as established by our change to the policy), the policy needed to more clearly state that royalty-sharing with creators applies to EPA employees only.

A memo was sent to the Provost, and will be later sent to the Chancellor, to provide the final approval. Upon approval by the Chancellor, the changes are publicly posted on the committee's website.

- **Copyright statement for Blackboard**

Blackboard administrators approached the committee to help draft language to post on the Blackboard website regarding the posting of copyrighted works on Blackboard. The following statement was written by the committee and posted on the UNC Blackboard site:

All copyrighted works posted and used on Blackboard are subject to U.S. copyright law. Copyright law and Fair Use Guidelines allow faculty to provide access to copyrighted materials using the Blackboard system, *as long as the instructor conducts a fair use analysis* < <http://www.lib.unc.edu/copyright/#3> > that supports the use. For assistance in

conducting a fair use analysis, contact the Chair of the Copyright Committee, Leah Dunn ([leahm@email.unc.edu](mailto:leahm@email.unc.edu)).

If a fair use analysis does not support the use, either permission of the rightsholder should be sought or an alternative should be considered. No centralized university funds are available to pay for permission fees. Some alternatives to consider are:

- Consult with your department to see if funds are available for classroom permission fees.
- Link directly to resources available in the University Library's many electronic databases. Linkguide<<http://www.lib.unc.edu/reserves/linkguide/>>provides instructions on how to create persistent links to many of the library's electronic resources.
- Instructors may also consider the use of the University Library's E-reserves<<http://www.lib.unc.edu/reserves>> or Health Sciences Library E-reserves <<http://eres.hsl.unc.edu/ereserves/home.htm>>. The library absorbs permission fee costs for material put on e-reserve.
- Substitute material that is not subject to copyright.

- **Research into Scholarly Communications position of peer institutions**

In order to keep abreast of trends among peer institutions in how copyright issues are administered, how policies are managed, and outreach achieved, the committee looked at copyright management practices at twenty-five peer institutions. The committee found that ten institutions have approved a copyright office or copyright director position. Four of these offices are less than two years old, showing that a university office dedicated solely to copyright is a fairly recent development among peer academic institutions. At UNC, Copyright and Scholarly Communication are jointly administered by the Office of Legal Counsel and the Library's Director of Scholarly Communication and Copyright.

- **Design of Copyright Tutorial**

To assist in the educational needs of faculty relating to the use of copyrighted works on Blackboard, the committee began the development of a copyright and fair use tutorial that we will make available on the Blackboard website. The goal is to have the tutorial complete and available on Blackboard's website by the beginning of the Fall 2009 semester.

**Topics that the committee plans to address in 2008-2009 are:**

- 1) Education regarding NIH guidelines for public access,
- 2) Publicity of new commercialization policy,
- 3) Outreach relating to Blackboard copyright and fair use tutorial,
- 3) Monitor copyright violation notices that students receive relating to peer-to-peer sharing and illegal downloading, working with the new Vice Chancellor for Information Security.

**POLICY QUESTIONS REGARDING  
SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT FINANCIAL AID  
University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill  
Academic Year 2007-08**

Need-based student financial aid protects access for students who otherwise could not afford to attend the University. Merit-based aid recognizes and rewards student talent and promise, without regard to need. Both are important sources for the recruitment and retention of undergraduate and graduate/professional students at the University.

The Office of Scholarships and Student Aid and the Office of Institutional Research will examine these questions during the 2007-08 academic year, in consultation with the Faculty Committee on Scholarships, Awards and Student Aid.

**A. Questions Related to Campus Enrollment Planning:**

1. How many more students will likely need financial aid under different enrollment growth scenarios, and in what types and amounts?
2. How will likely tuition and fee increases at the state or campus level impact the need for additional grant aid, and for whom?
3. How does the University begin to address the scholarship and financial needs of international students? of undocumented students?
4. What do we know about "middle income" students who just miss qualifying for federally means-tested student aid, and how do these students/families pay for education?
5. What type of aid program would best serve the needs of "middle income" students attending Chapel Hill, if the Board decides that we should create one?
6. What is the proportional use of "hold harmless" funds between undergraduate and graduate students?
7. How effective is Carolina's current effort to attract the highest achieving in-state and out-of-state students through expanding its merit scholarship program?

**B. Recurring Questions Related to the Distribution and Allocation of Aid:**

1. What is the proper balance between:
  - a. need-based and merit-based aid;
  - b. aid to graduate/professional and undergraduate students;
  - c. aid to in-state and out-of-state students?
2. What are the appropriate relative roles of the student, the family, the institution, the state, and the federal government in paying for one's education?

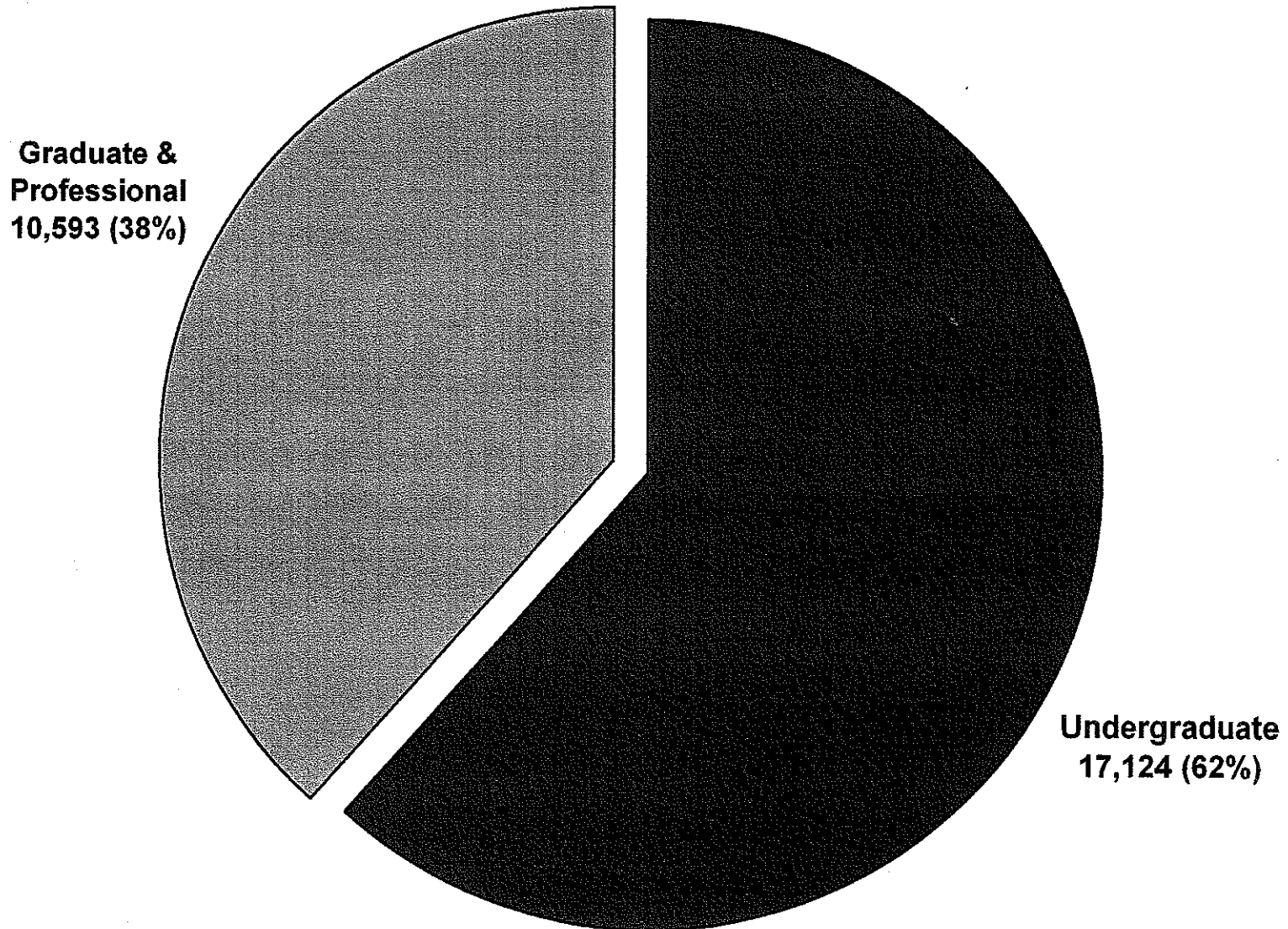

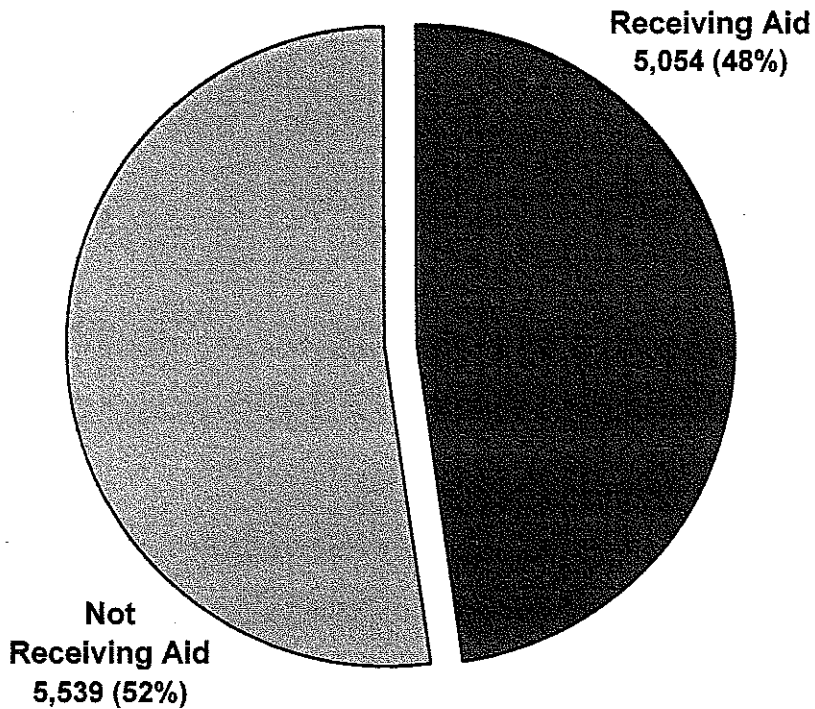
# Percentages of Enrolled Students Receiving Any Aid in 2006-2007

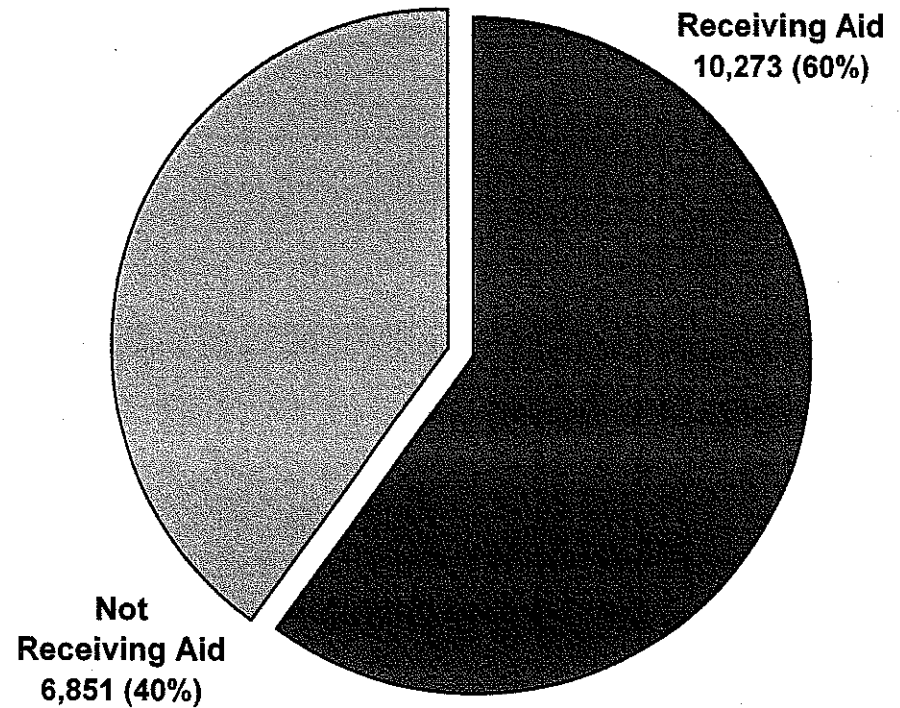
## Percent of Enrolled Graduate & Professional Students Receiving Aid

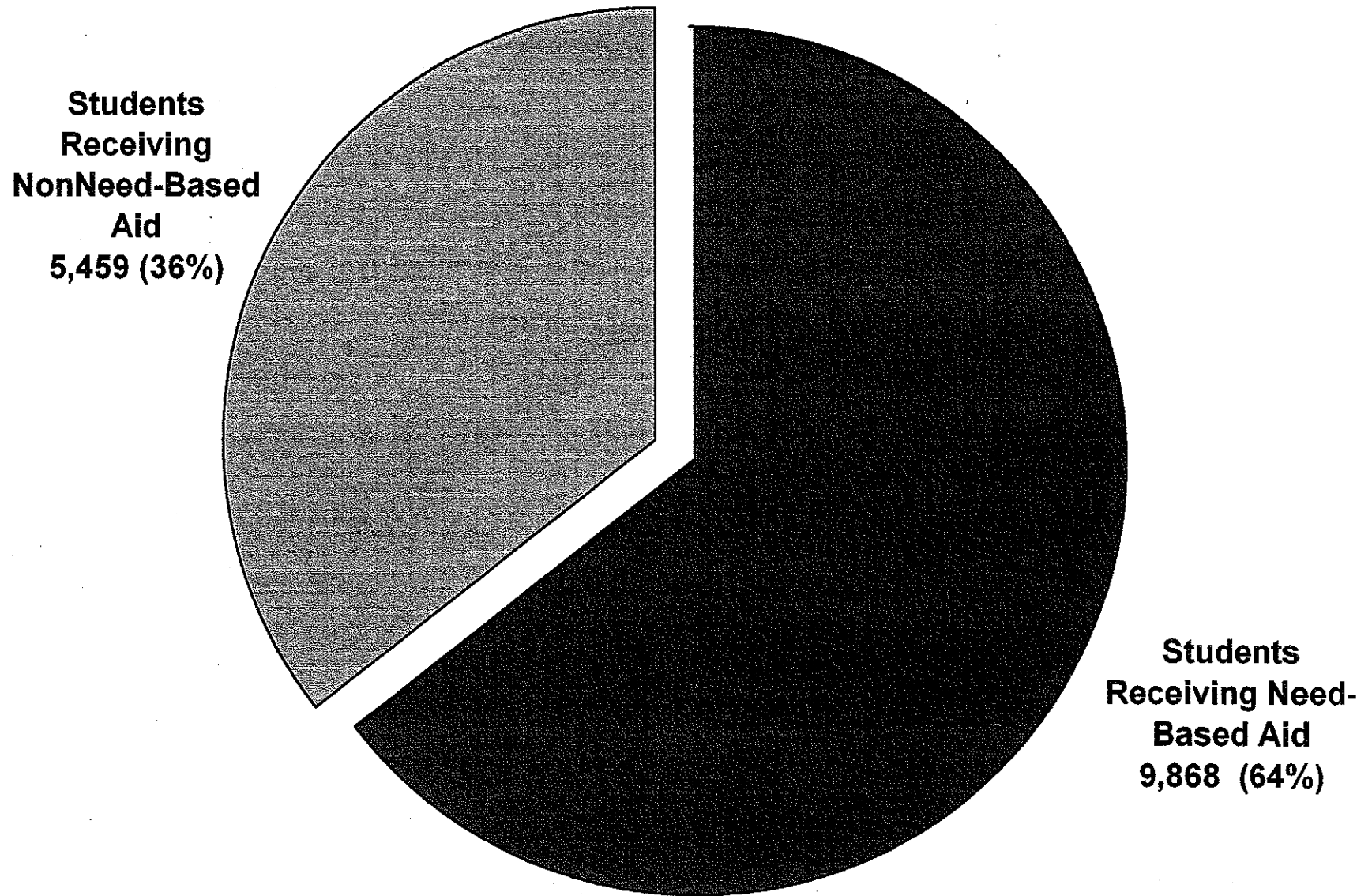


## Percent of Enrolled Undergraduate Students Receiving Aid

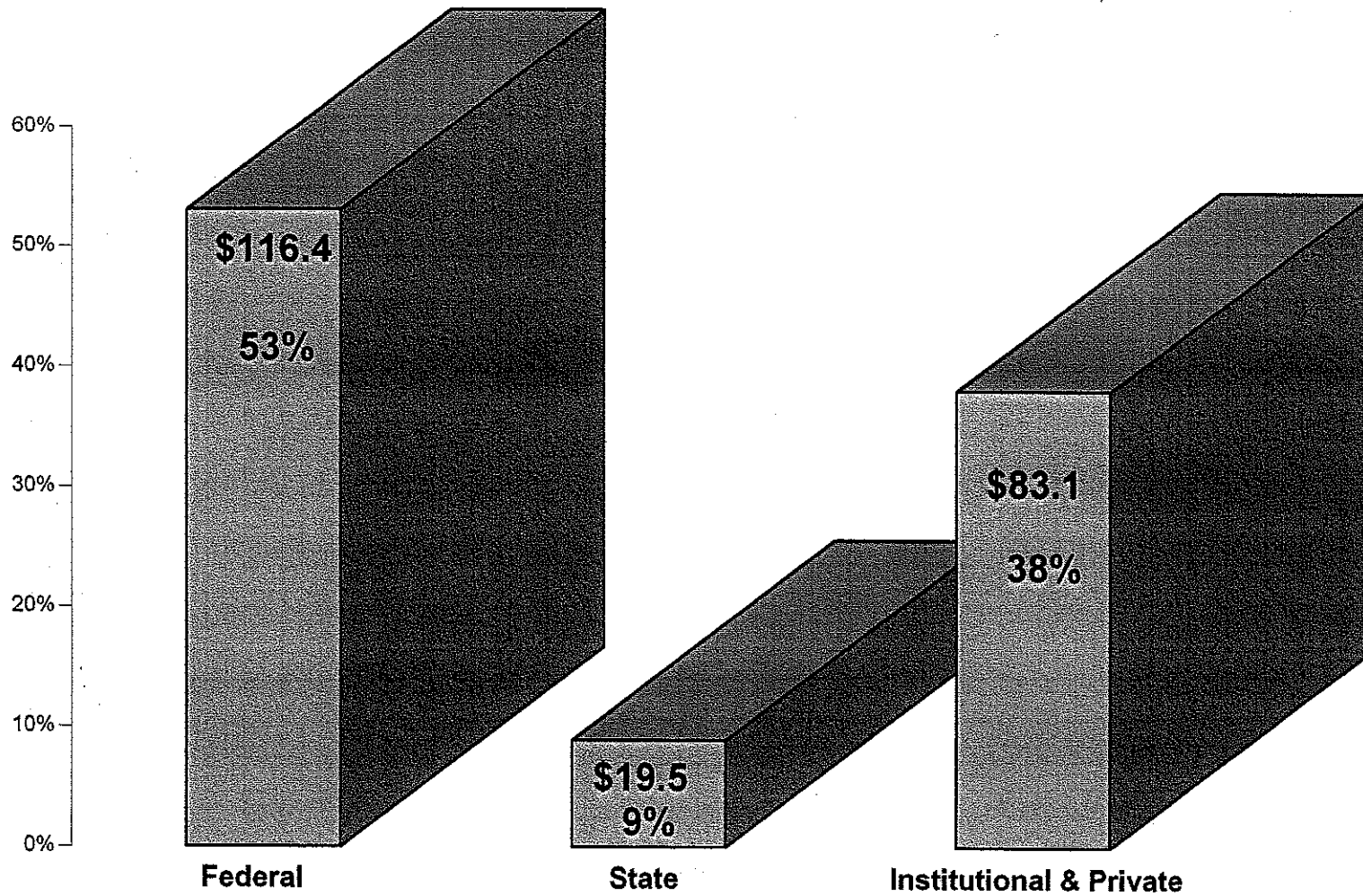

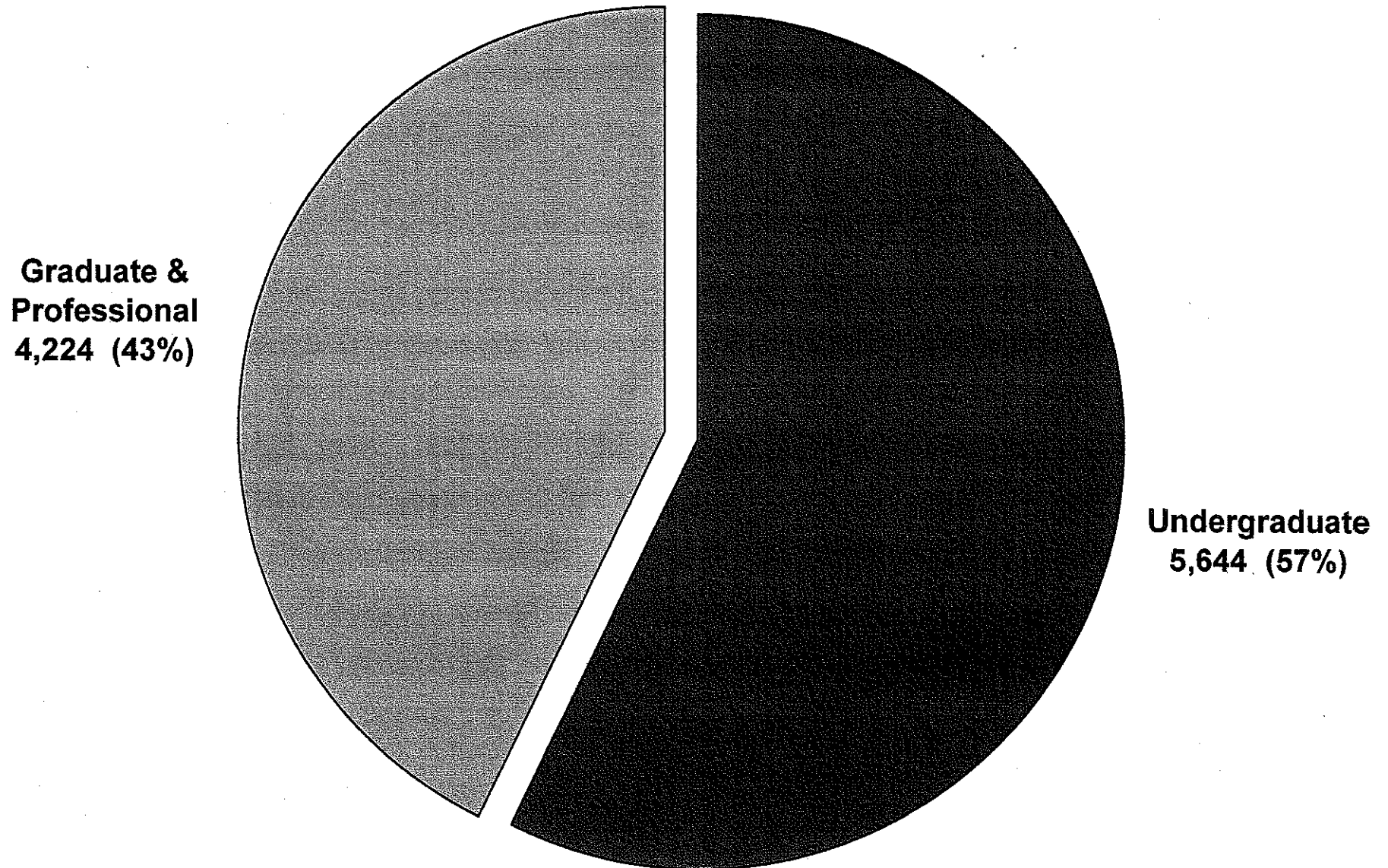
**All Students Receiving Any Aid 2006-2007

## Total Aid Distributed to All Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions

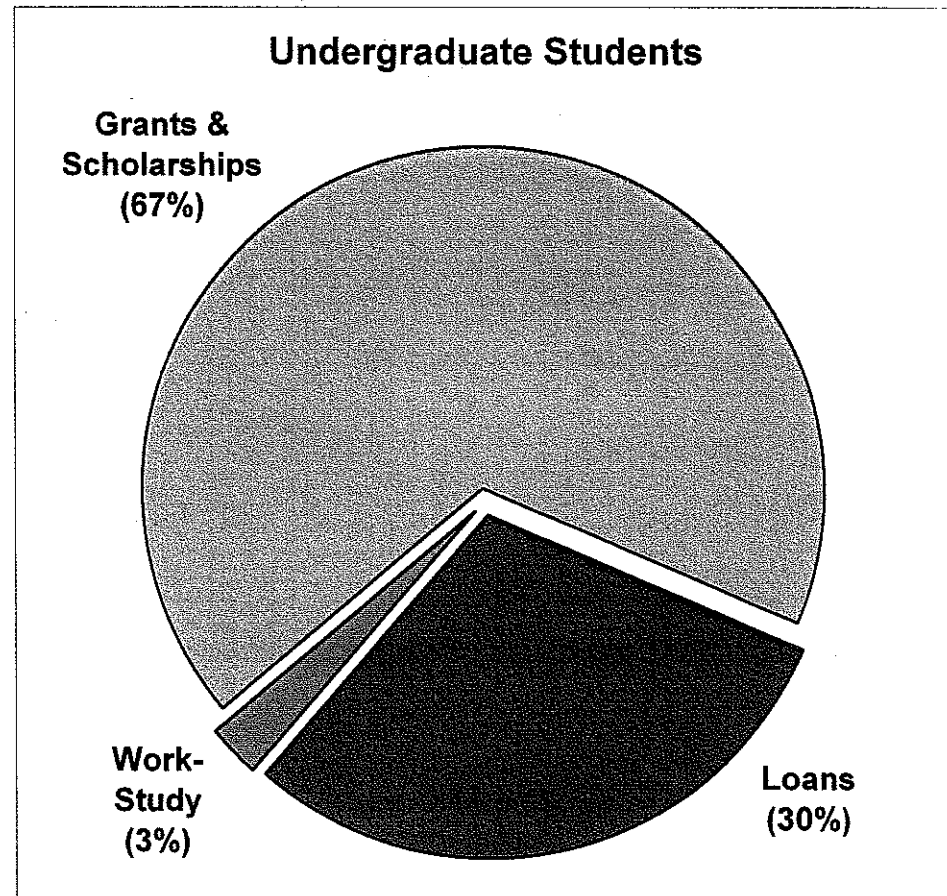
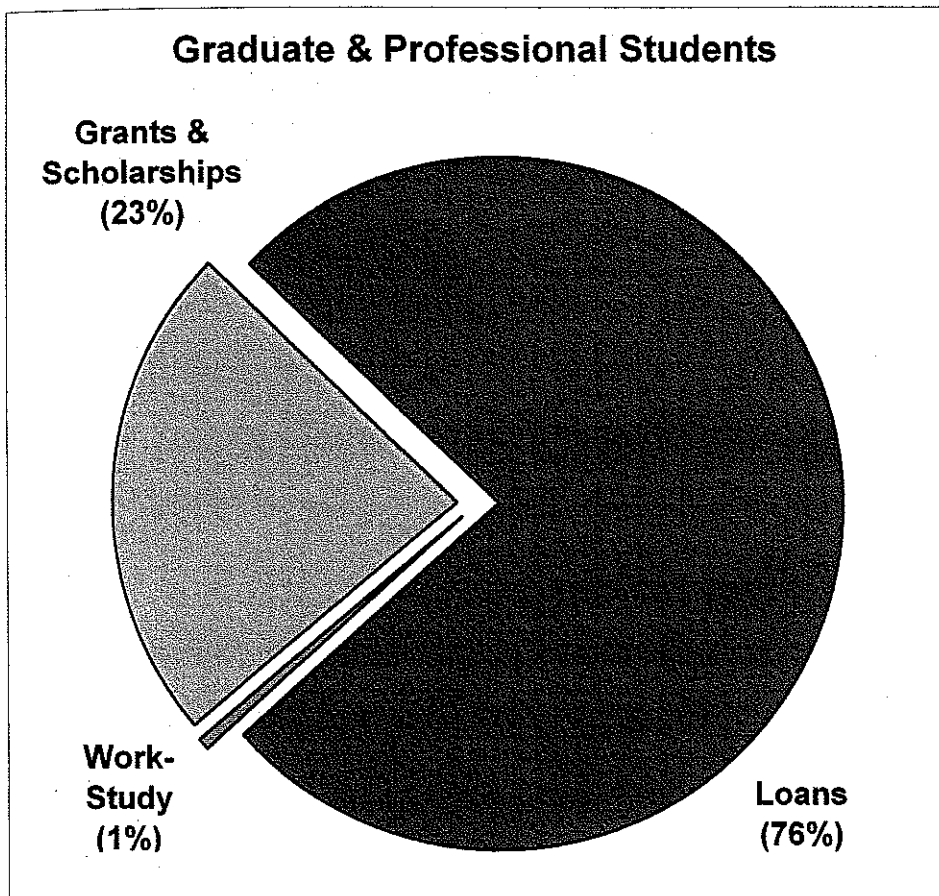


**All Students Receiving Need-Based Aid 2006-2007

## Need-Based Aid Distributed to Students, by Type 2006-2007

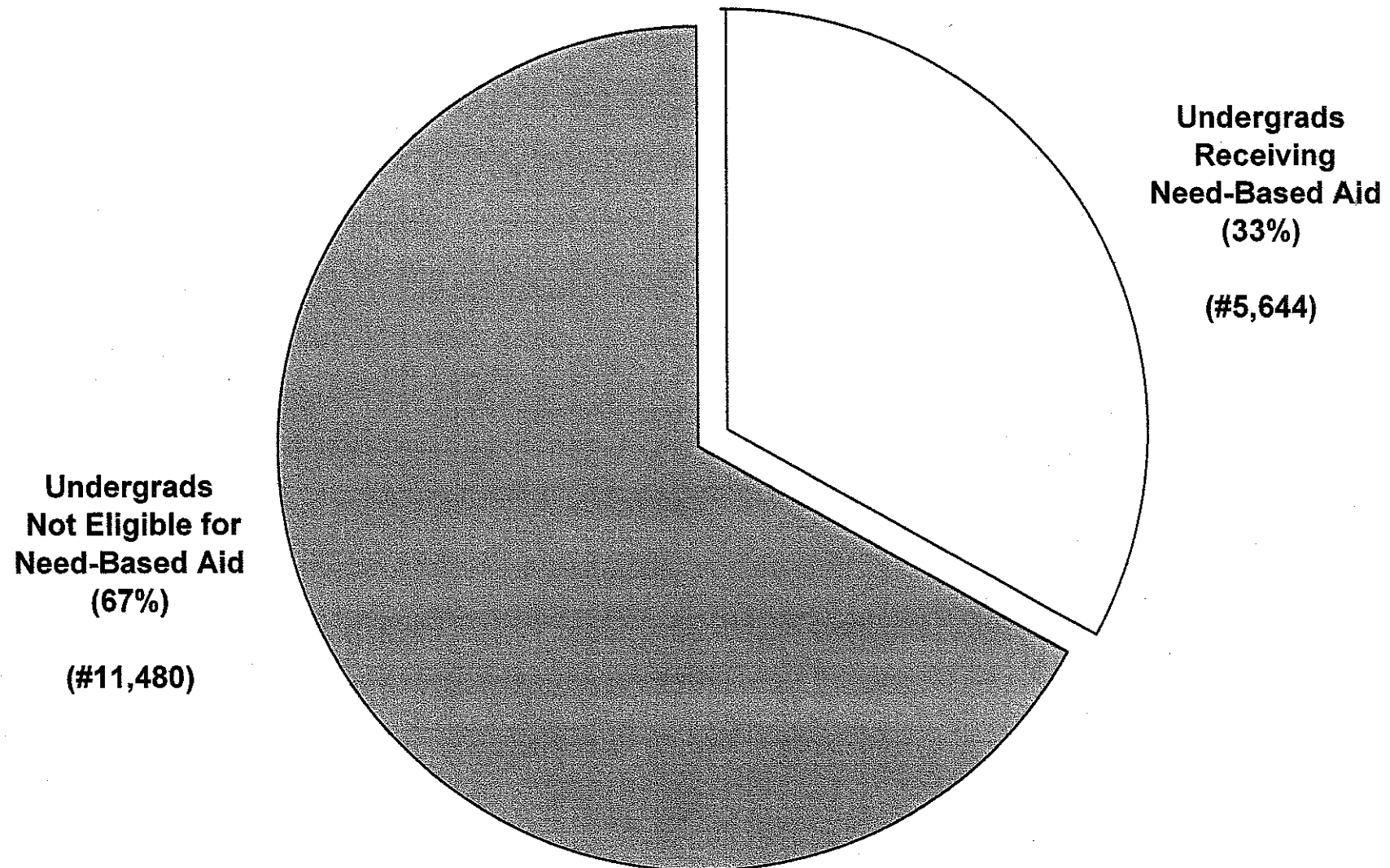




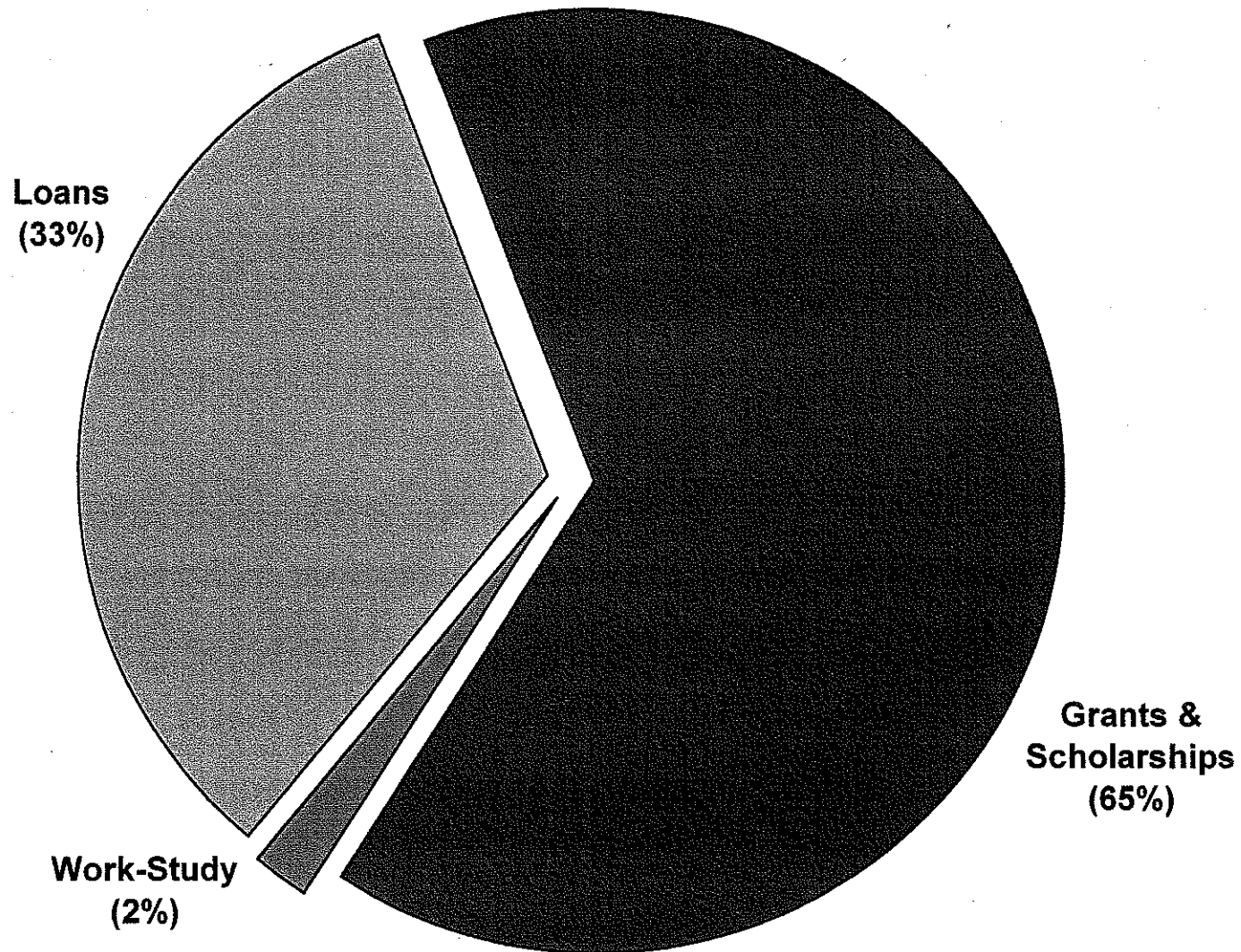
# Percent of All Undergraduate Students Receiving Need-Based Aid 2006-2007

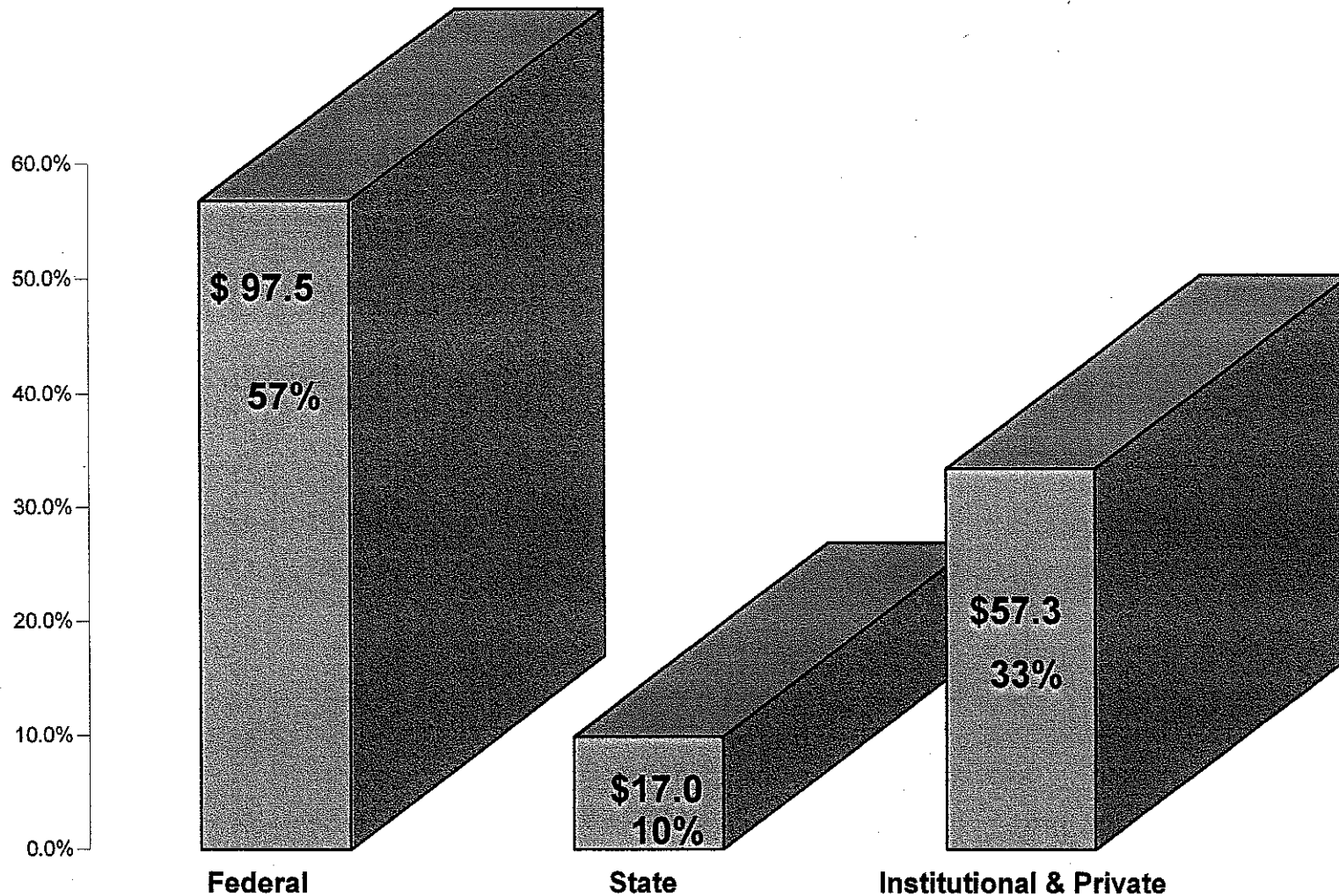

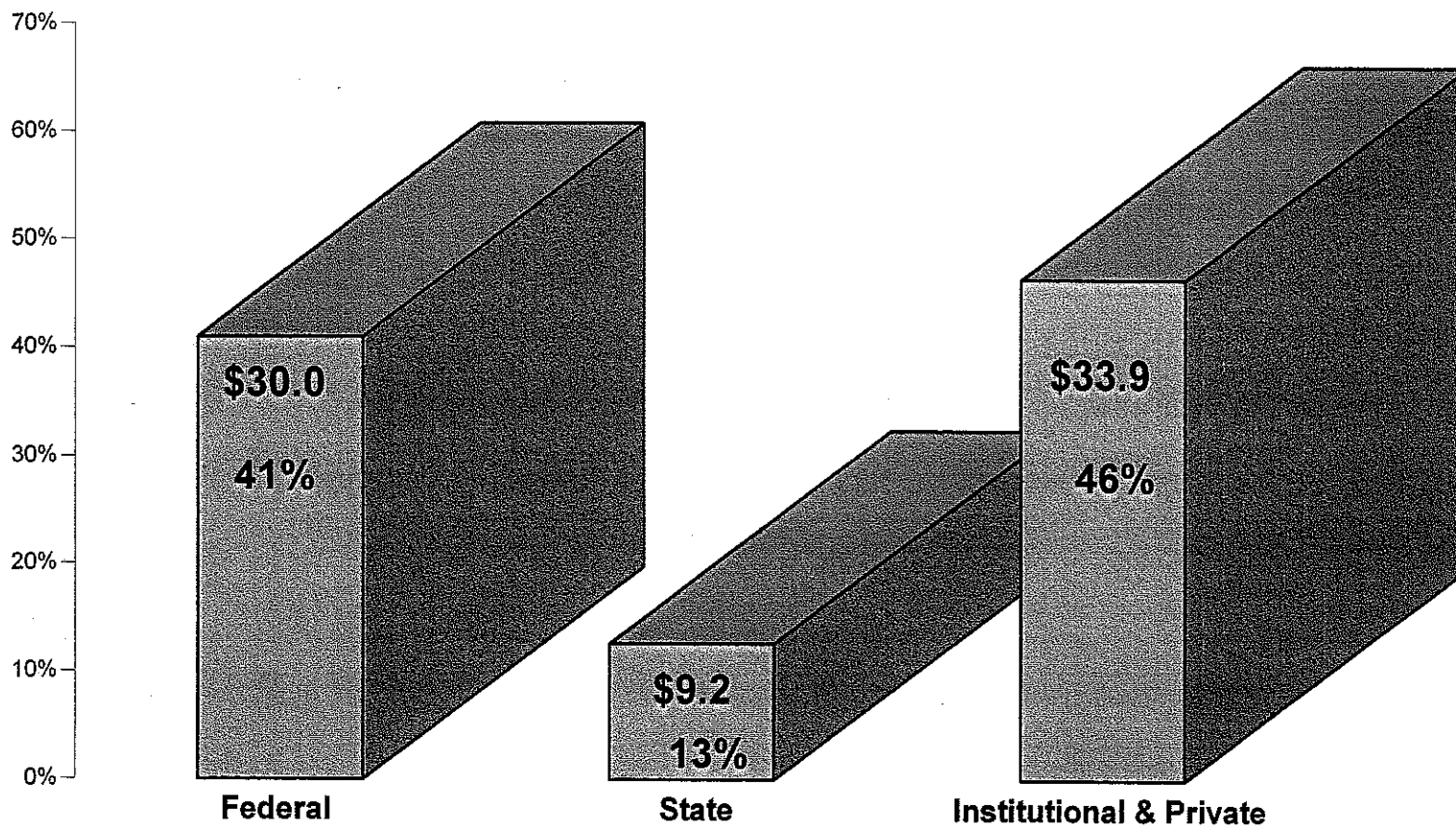

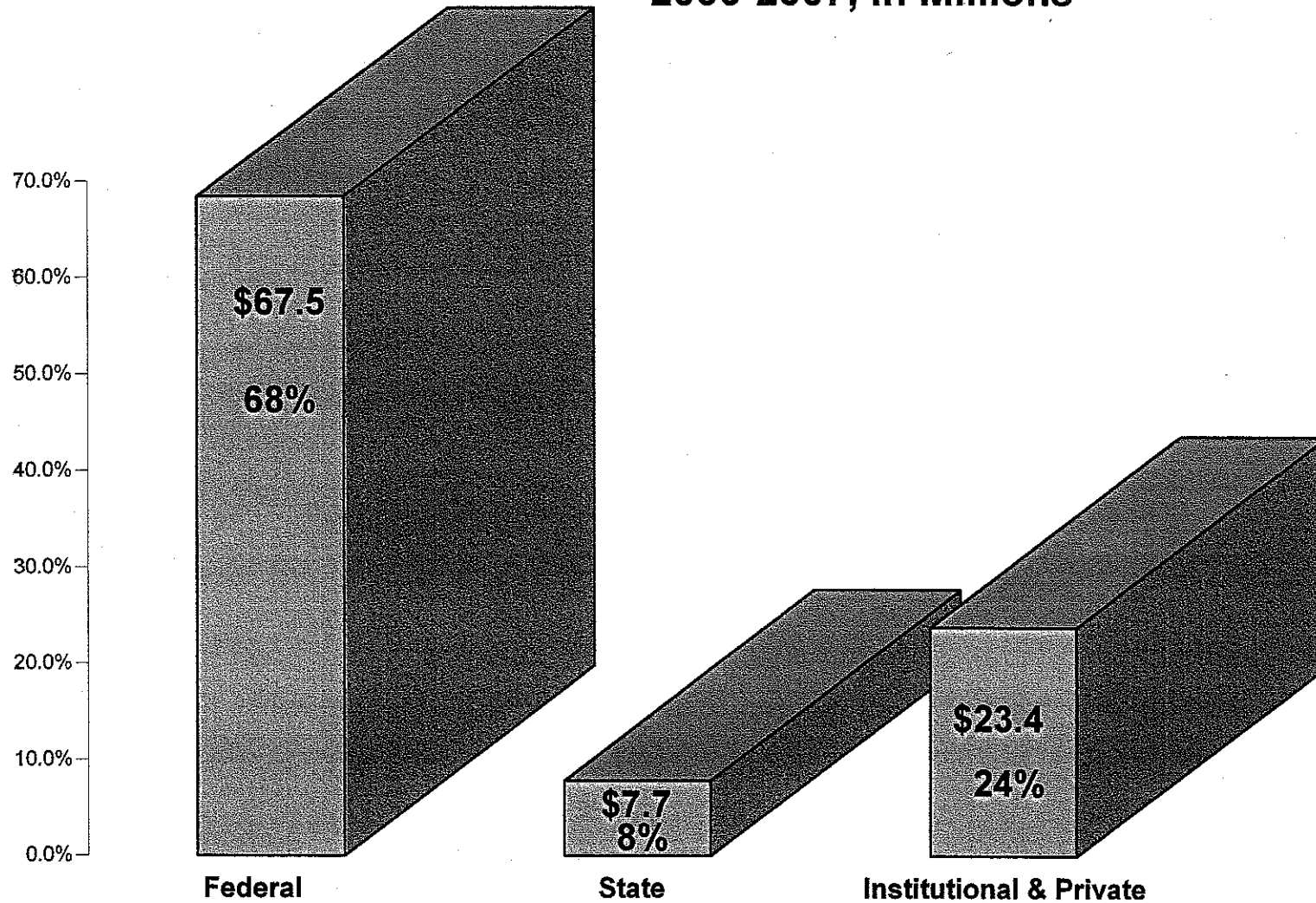
## Need-Based Aid Distributed to All Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions



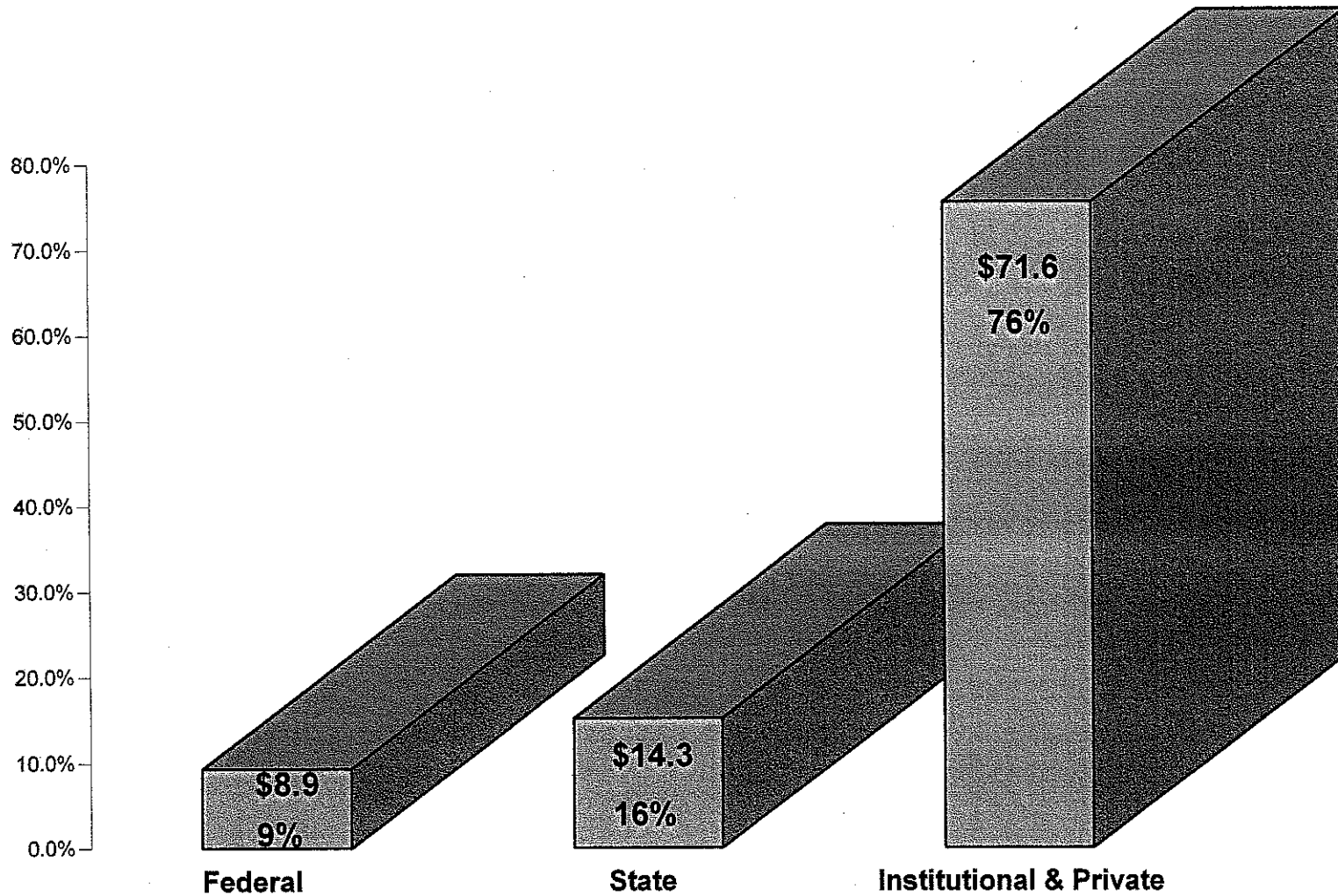
## Need-Based Aid Distributed to Undergraduates, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions



## Need-Based Aid Distributed to Graduate/Professional Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions

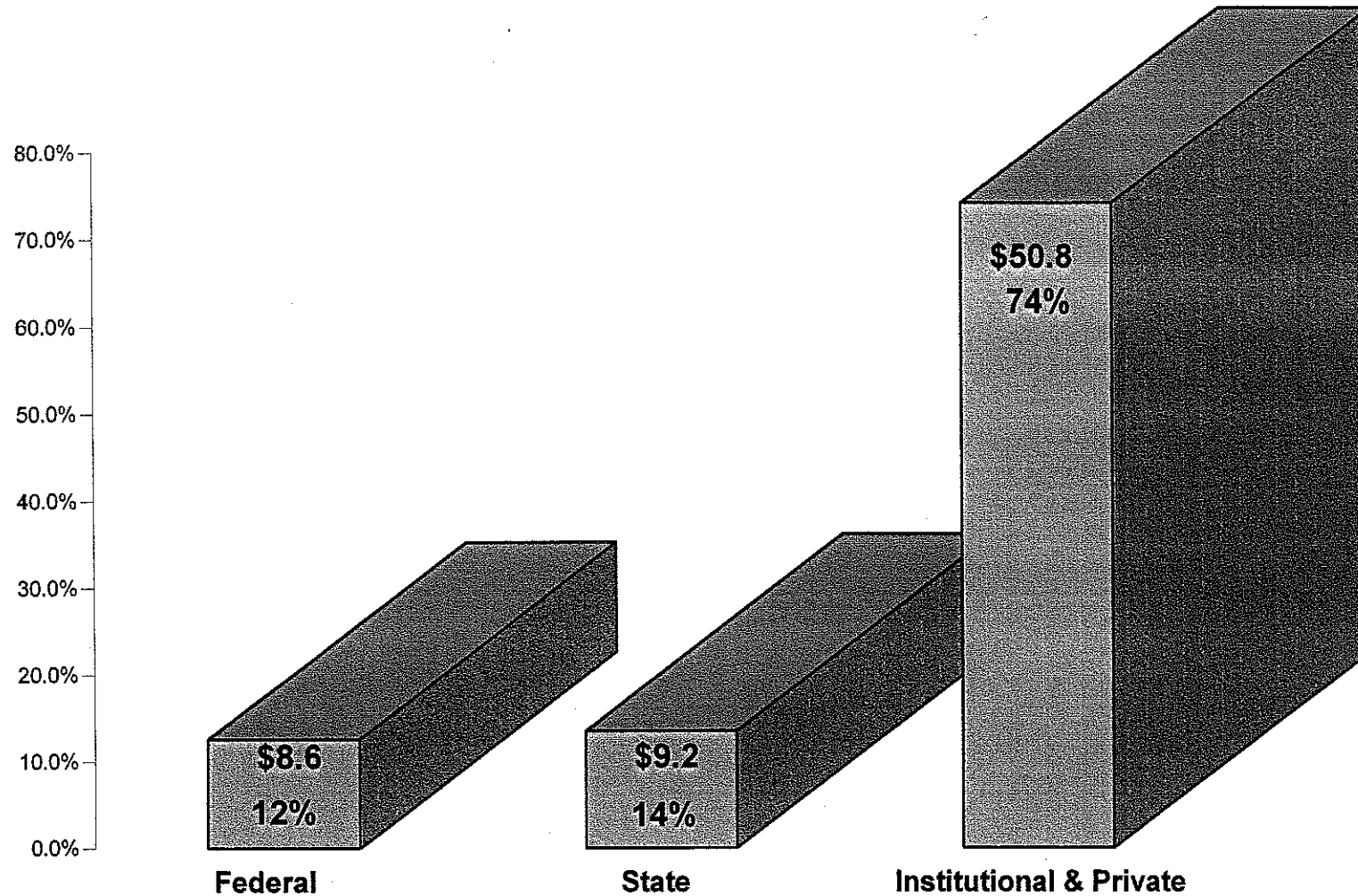


## Gift Aid Distributed to All Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions

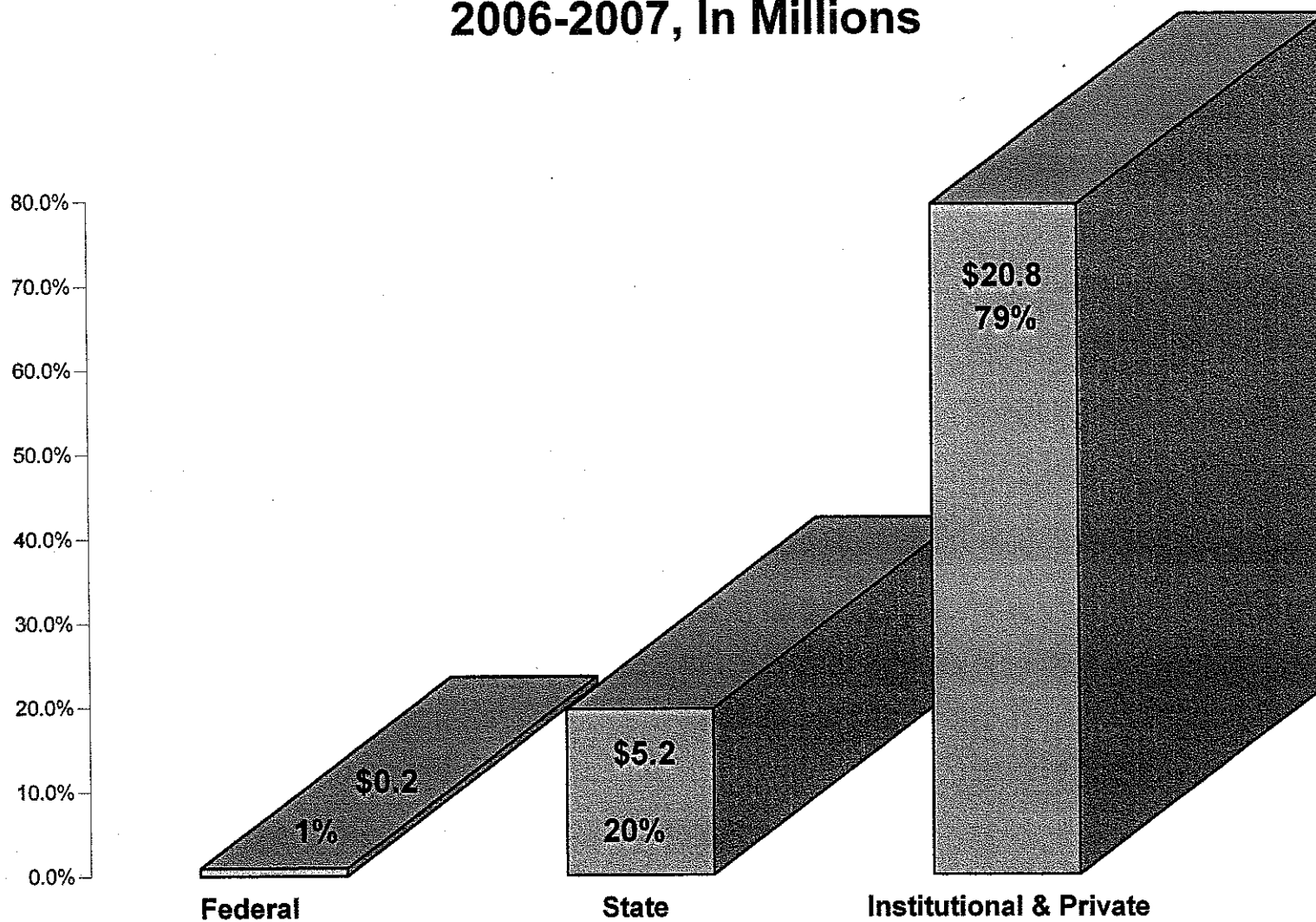




## Gift Aid Distributed to Undergraduates, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions

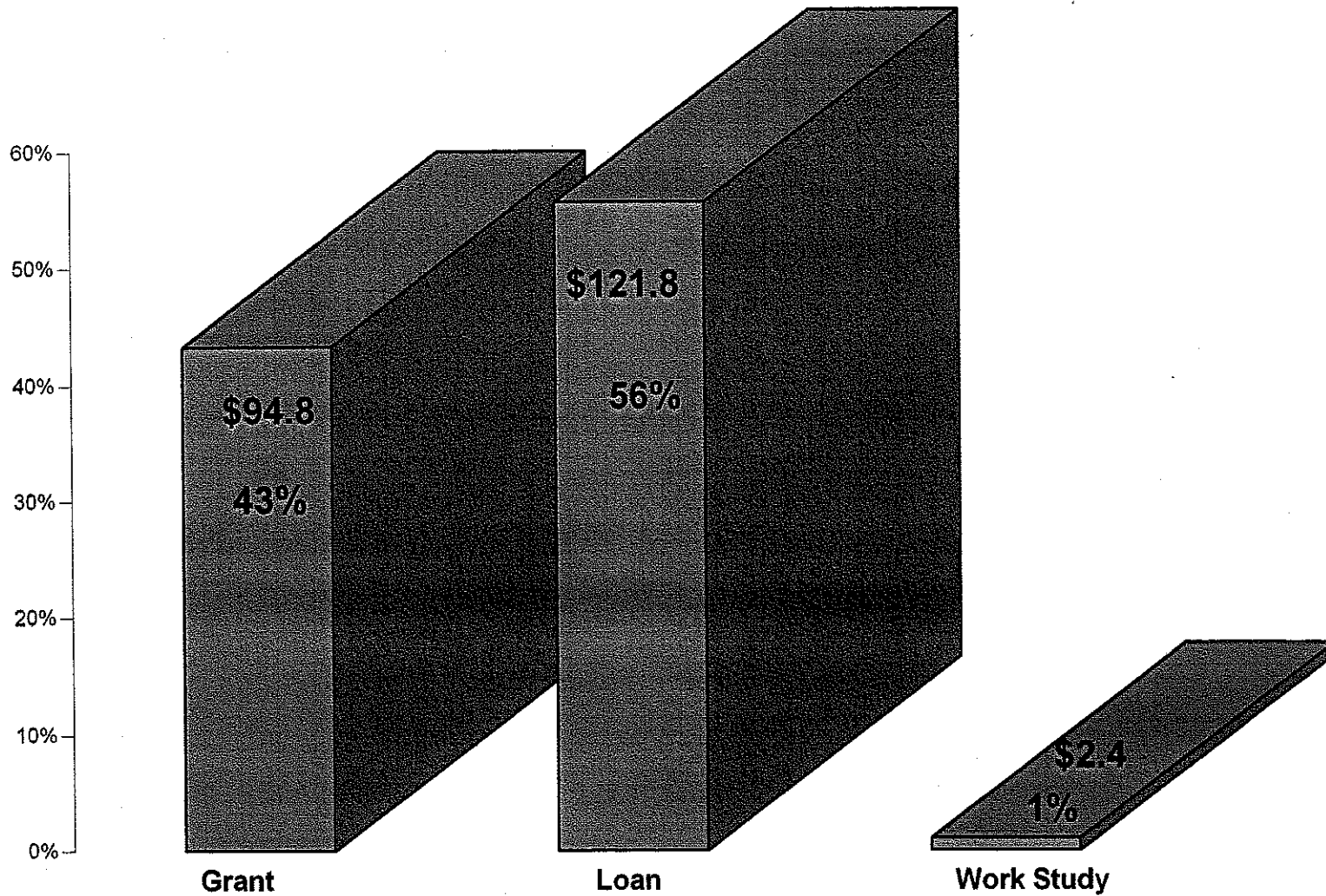

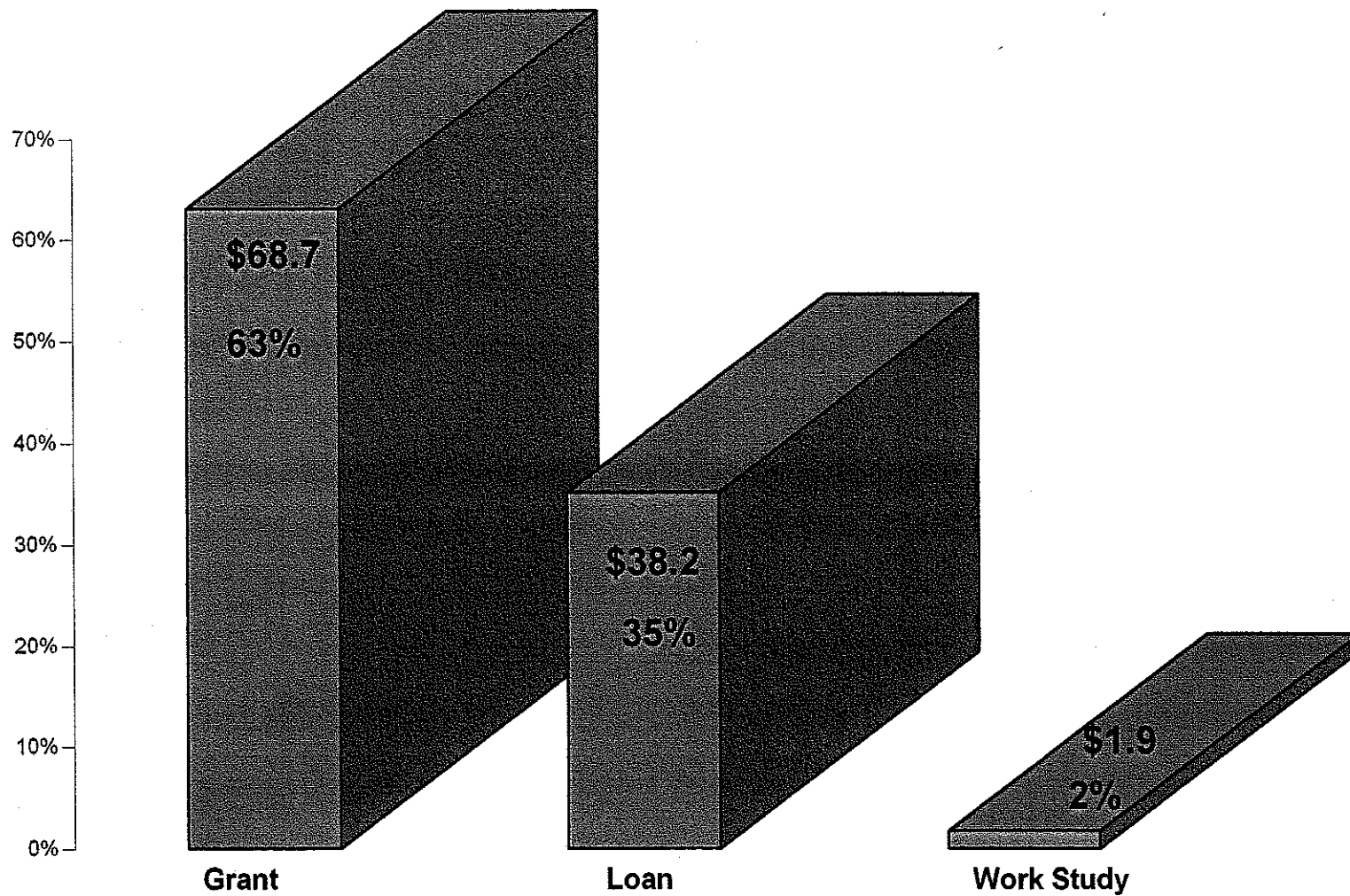




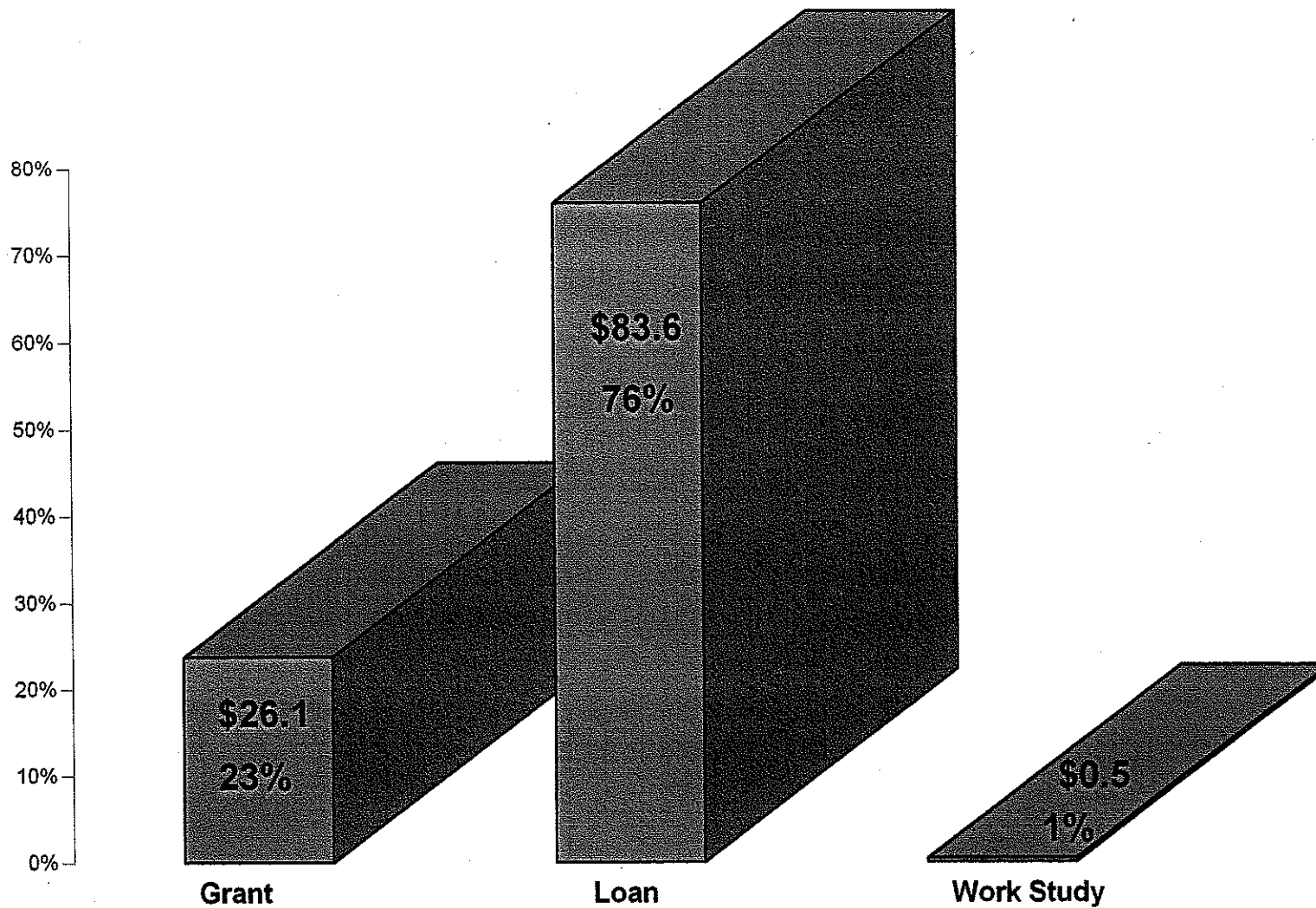
## Total Aid Distributed to All Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



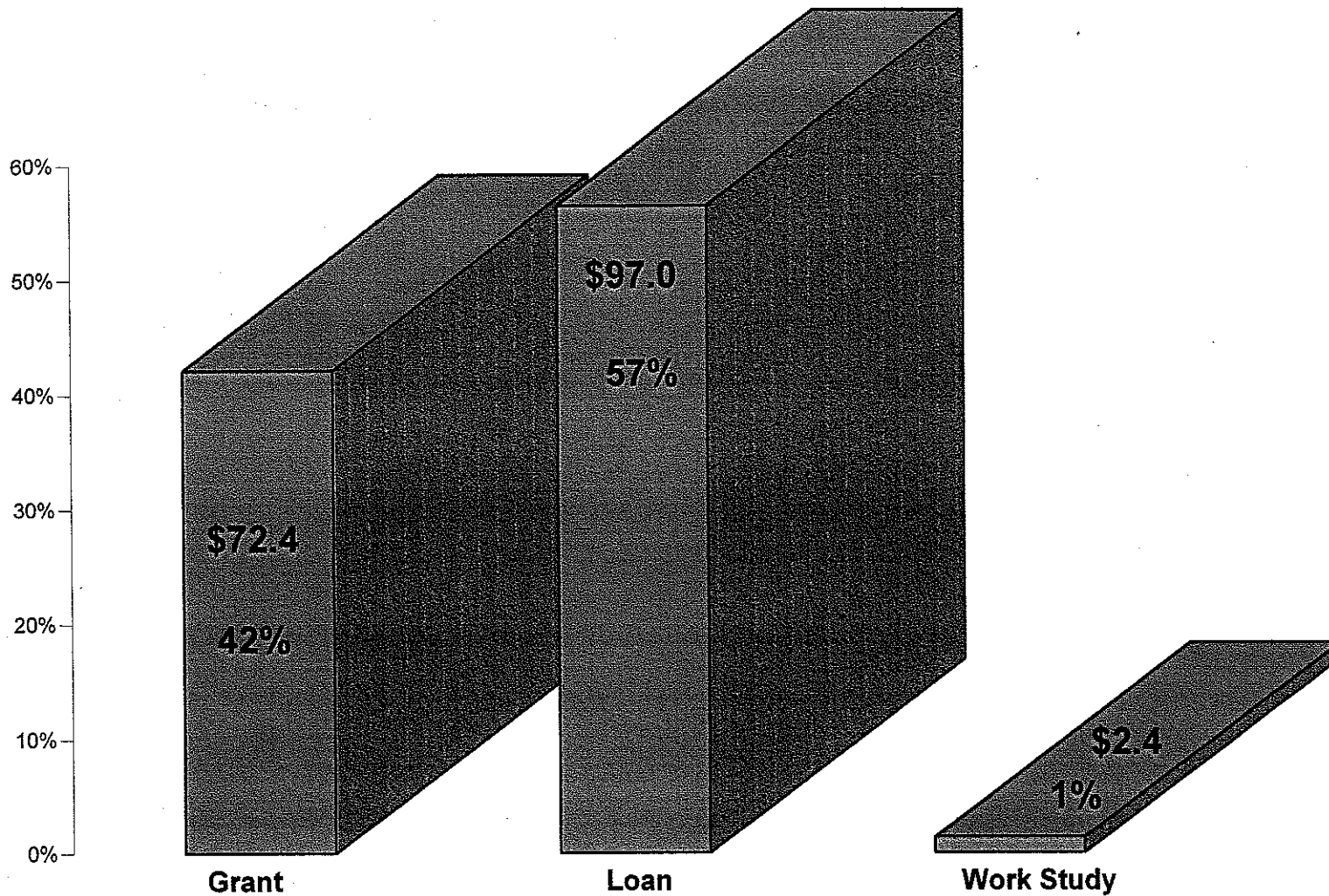
## Total Aid Distributed to Undergraduate Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



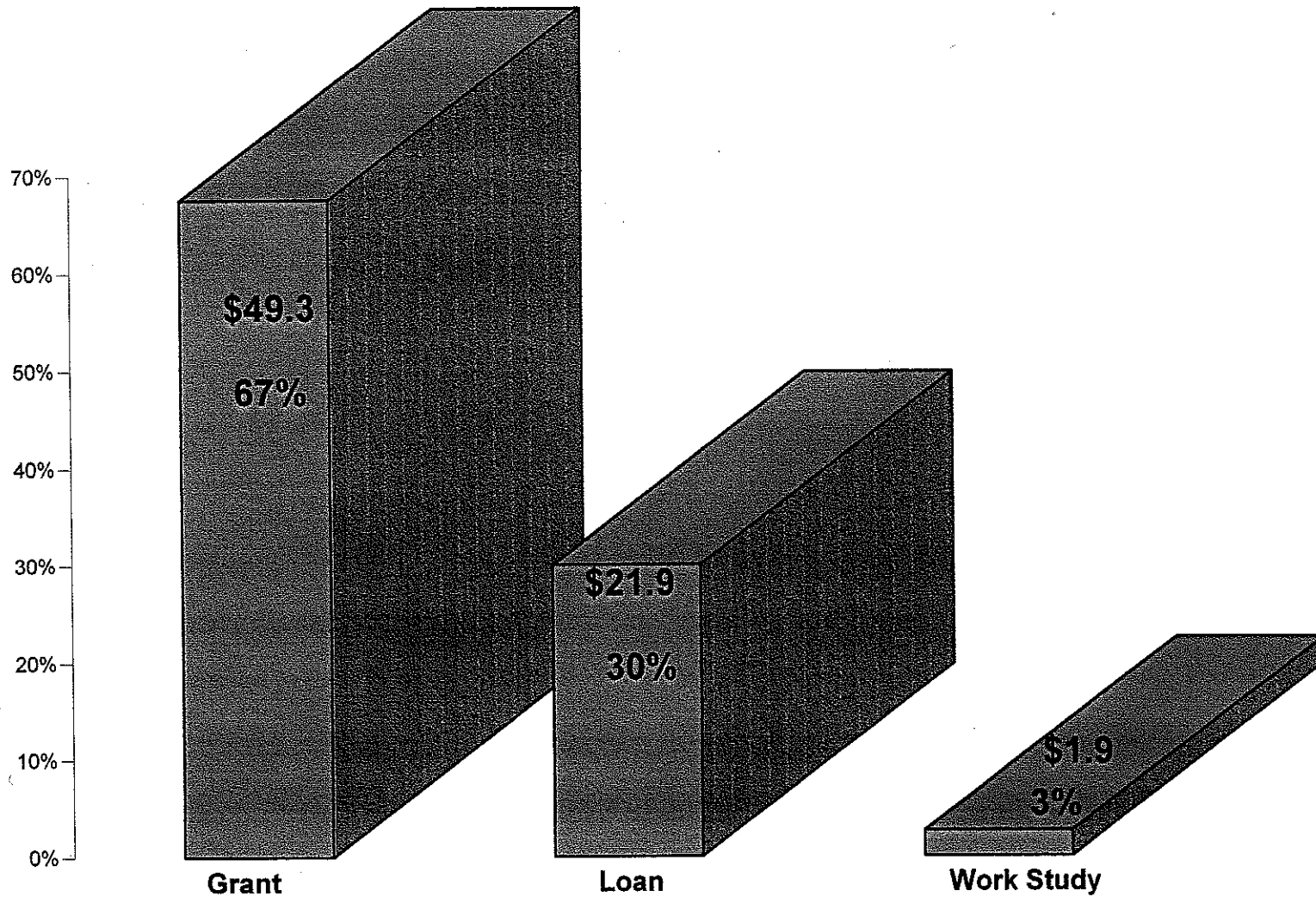
## Total Aid Distributed to Graduate/Professional Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



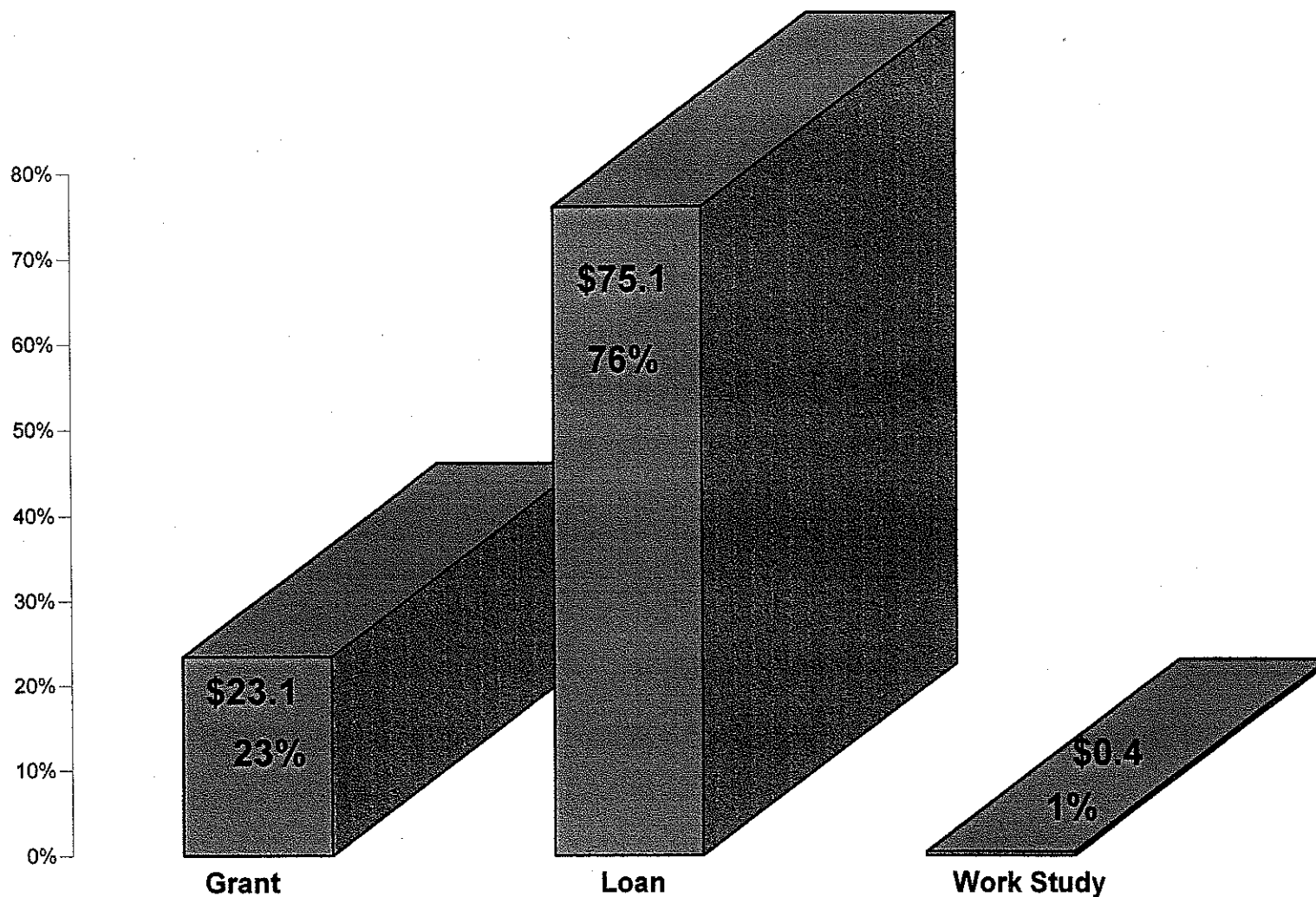
## Need-Based Aid Distributed to All Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions

# UNC-Chapel Hill Office of Faculty Governance

Resolution 2008-2. On Amending the Faculty Code of University Government to Provide a Term Limit for the Office of Chair of the Faculty.

*Presented by the Committee on University Government*

The General Faculty enacts:

Section 3-1 of the Faculty Code of University Government is amended as follows:

**"§ 3-1. The chair of the faculty.**

- (a) The chair of the faculty serves as chair pro tempore of the Faculty Council and of the General Faculty, makes an annual report to the Faculty Council on the state of the faculty, represents the chancellor in all academic matters whenever the chancellor may request him or her to do so, and has such other responsibilities as may be determined by the chancellor or the Faculty Council.
- (b) The chair of the faculty serves for a term of three years and is not eligible for ~~election to more than two consecutive terms~~ immediate reelection. Nominations and elections are held every third year, and the person elected takes office on July 1 following the election.
- (c) Nominations are made by the Advisory Committee, which announces the upcoming election to all members of the voting faculty and invites recommendations of persons to be nominated. The Committee selects and submits the names of at least two qualified persons. The nominee receiving the highest number of votes in the election is elected, unless he or she has failed to receive a majority of the votes cast. In that event, a run-off election is held between those who received the highest and the next highest number of votes in the previous election, and the person receiving the highest number of votes in the run-off election is elected. Interim vacancies in the office of chair of the faculty are filled through appointment by the Advisory Committee."

After listening to two of my verbal presentations at University Affairs meetings, Eve and I bumped into each other on Polk Place one day, and in her effervescent "Eve speak" she said, "I love those stories and jokes you tell at BOT meetings. Are those reports?"

My job today is simple. I am supposed to represent UNC faculty. It is always difficult to do so well; today it is simply impossible. Nonetheless, I want to say, on behalf of faculty, to the Carson family and to the Carolina family, that Eve Carson was the reason we came to work on March 4, and Eve Carson will be the reason we will come to work on March 19. You see, we have important work to do with you students, and we intend to meet our obligations to all of the Eve Carsons who pass through Carolina. As faculty, we pledge to give you the education you deserve, whether you want it or not.

My impression was that Eve never slept, and I want to close with a Native American prayer entitled *A Celebration of Life*.

"Do not stand by my grave and weep. I am not here. I do not sleep.

I am a thousand winds that blow. I am the diamond glint on snow.

I am the sun on ripened grain. I am the gentle autumn rain.

When you awake in morning hush, I am the swift uplifting rush

Of quiet birds in circling light. I am the soft starlight at night.

Do not stand at my grave and weep. I am not there. I do not sleep."

# UNC-Chapel Hill Office of Faculty Governance

## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE GENERAL FACULTY AND THE FACULTY COUNCIL

**March 28, 2008**

The General Faculty and Faculty Council of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill convened at 3:00 p.m. in the Hitchcock Multipurpose Room of the Sonja Haynes Stone Center for Black Culture and History.

### **Chancellor's Remarks and Question Period**

Chancellor James Moeser began by congratulating four Carolina students who have recently won distinguished national or international scholarships: Michael Tarrant—Luce Scholarship; Danielle Allen—Truman Scholar; Lisa Bond—Churchill Scholar; and Stephanie Jones—Churchill Scholar. The chancellor acknowledged the splendid work of Prof. George Lensing who has been highly effective in mentoring students who wish to compete for these fiercely competitive awards under the auspices of the Office of Distinguished Scholarships.

Chancellor Moeser mentioned a new proposal from the Association of American Universities that urges the next president to strengthen the nation's scientific and technological workforce and infrastructure and to better integrate science into the national policy agenda. He said that the proposal stems from a recent report by a group headed by Harvard President Drew Faust about the harmful effects of flat NIH funding on the next generation of biomedical scientists and researchers. The chancellor said that funding stagnation at NIH has increased grant competition so much that the average age of a first-time grant recipient is 43. He said that so far we have continued to see growth in Carolina's research funding, but we are monitoring the situation carefully. Six of the 10 largest NIH institutions saw decreases in their funding last year.

Prof. Diane Leonard voiced her concern that the University needs to do more to protect our students. She spoke movingly of her distress over the murder of Eve Carson, who was her student, and pointed

out that many students need to be out late at night. She mentioned the Daily Tar Heel staff, student radio announcers, and students involved in theater events as examples.

Chancellor Moeser replied that the administration shares this concern and is thinking of ways to respond. He pointed out that Point-to-Point service is available 24 hours a day.

### **Provost's Remarks**

Provost Bernadette Gray-Little reported on a number of searches:

- G. Williamson McDiarmid, Boeing Professor of Teacher Education at the University of Washington, Seattle, has agreed to be recommended to the Board of Trustees as the new dean of the School of Education. It is anticipated that the appointment will become effective January 1, 2009. McDiarmid received an A.B. in American Studies from Carolina (1969) and an Ed.D. from Harvard (1984).
- The search for dean of the Graduate School has concluded and an announcement is anticipated soon.
- The search for dean of the Kenan-Flagler Business School has begun with a strong list of candidates. Interviews are scheduled for the end of April and early May.
- Prof. Patrick Conway has accepted appointment as the first director of the Center for Faculty Excellence, effective July 1.

Provost Gray-Little introduced Vice Chancellor for Information Services Larry Conrad, who greeted the Council. Vice Chancellor Conrad said that he will be focused on making the central IT organization more customer-related, that he is interested in outreach and engagement on campus, and that he is working closely with departmental IT managers.

Chancellor Moeser announced that Exec. Assoc. Provost Steve Allred has been named provost of the University of Richmond, effective July 1. He praised Allred as a major instrument of administrative success at Carolina.

### **Enrollment Growth**

Chancellor Moeser introduced the topic of enrollment growth by pointing that that the UNC Tomorrow initiative has identified the need for the UNC System to accommodate 80,000 additional North Carolina students by 2017. He said that Carolina will be expected to shoulder our share of that growth, but in a thoughtful, informed way. The chancellor said that the primary practical considerations related to growth are (1) funding for new faculty lines, support staff, graduate students, and facilities, and (2) maintaining highly selective admissions standards so that the quality of the entering class and the student experience at Carolina are not diminished.

Provost Gray-Little said that the University has retained two consulting firms to help with planning for enrollment growth. Paulien & Associates will address needs for physical space, and the Arts & Science Group will address how enrollment growth could affect resources and quality. The provost said that the current Master Plan, developed 10 years ago, was based on an enrollment of 27,500 whereas we have already passed the 28,000 mark. Preliminary studies have shown that Carolina is doing well at utilizing current space efficiently.

### **Annual Report of the Committee on Buildings and Grounds**

Prof. David Owens, chair of the Committee on Buildings and Grounds, presented the committee's annual report by title.

Prof. Gregory Copenhaver (Biology) said that as a result of the recent ban on smoking within 100 feet of campus buildings, people have begun to drag office furniture into wooded areas behind the hospital to furnish makeshift smoking areas. He likened the appearance to a hobo camp and asked whether benches might be provided in such areas. Another member of the Council who lives near the hospital complex reported that smokers have been gathering in her yard after dark. Prof. Owens said he would bring these concerns to the committee's attention.

Prof. John Sweeney (Journalism & Mass Communication) asked whether advocacy for green space is part of the committee's charge. Prof. Owens reported that there is a green space plan and a task force on heritage trees and landscape. Chancellor Moeser said that the Master Plan calls for 10 additional acres of green space on campus. This has been accomplished largely by putting new buildings on asphalt parking lots and accommodating vehicles in parking decks.

Prof. Charles Daye, chair of the Committee on Scholarships and Student Aid, presented the committee's annual report and summarized salient statistics. He pointed out that federal support for student aid has been declining with support from institutional and private sources filling the gap.

Prof. Michael Lienesch, chair of the Committee on University Government, presented Resolution 2008-2 for passage on second reading. The resolution was adopted without dissent and is ordered enrolled.

#### [Introduction to the Summer School](#)

Dean of the Summer School Ian Yopp briefed the Council on the mission and structure of the Summer School. The School operates in two five-week sessions each year. Most of the students are our own, but there are typically from 700 to 1,000 visiting students from other institutions. The School is financed entirely by receipts; it receives no state appropriations and, therefore, operates much like a small business. About 95% of its \$5 million annual budget goes toward its core mission of teaching; only 5% is needed for administration. Dean Yopp said that there is a good balance among the various faculty ranks in the School faculty, which numbered 550 last year. The course offerings look much like regular semester offerings, except that most are undergraduate courses with few 400 level and higher courses. The student body is diverse with all 100 North Carolina counties represented, many international students, and a number of non-traditional students. Most of the students are enrolled in Arts & Sciences courses. The ratio of in-state to out-of-state students is seven to one. The average



GPA is 2.9, which demonstrates that Summer School is not primarily remedial. In 2007, the School enrolled 14,000 students over both sessions.

Dean Yopp said that the number of study abroad courses being offered through the Summer School is expected to decline. The School will continue to offer those existing courses whose faculty want to continue them, but all new programs will be routed through the Study Abroad Office.

In response to questions, Dean Yopp said the Housing Office handles housing in residence halls that remain open in the summer; some programs offer courses for graduate students but not many; and summer school students are eligible for financial aid if they take at least 6 hours per session.

#### Opportunities for Diversity Training for Faculty

Dr. Cookie Newsom, director of diversity education and research in the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Affairs, and Prof. Donna Bickford, director of the Carolina Women's Center, reviewed opportunities for diversity training for faculty.

#### Scholars at Risk Program

Prof. Judith Blau (Sociology) spoke of the Scholars at Risk Program. This is a network of close to 1,000 college and university faculty across the country who work with scholars who are persecuted in their native lands because of their beliefs and scholarly pursuits. They tend to be people who trained in Western universities and, as a result, hold Western ideas. The network is coordinated by its home office at New York University. Locally, Prof. Beth Kurtz-Costes (Psychology) and Sarah Shields (History) are members of the network. The home office assists scholars with visas and placement. When an American institution agrees to host a scholar at risk, the typical arrangement is for the scholar to take up residence for one semester to teach and conduct research. Prof. Blau said that the program is trying to build an endowment to enable it to render assistance on short notice.
