***Faculty elections begin Monday, April 13; Chair of the Faculty to be selected***

The annual faculty elections will be conducted during the week of April 13-20 via an electronic survey that will be emailed on Monday to all members of the Voting Faculty. A highlight of this year's elections will be selection of a new Chair of the Faculty to succeed Joe Templeton, whose term ends June 30. The candidates for Chair of the Faculty are McKay Coble, Professor of Design and Chair of the Department of Dramatic Art; and Arne Kalleberg, Kenan Distinguished Professor of Sociology. The winner will serve three years in this post.

Faculty-wide elections will also be held for positions on the eleven elected faculty standing committees, while voters will also select Faculty Council representatives from their respective divisions.

Voting-eligible faculty includes all tenured and tenure-track faculty, professional librarians, as well as fixed-term faculty whose terms of appointment meet certain criteria spelled out in the Faculty Code. Last year, 800 of 3294 distributed ballots were returned, for a "turnout" rate of 23%. This year we'd like to see turnout go way up! We encourage you to consider the issues and positions expressed. Your vote counts!
