***Coble, Kalleberg are candidates for Chair of the Faculty***

Two faculty members have agreed to run for Chair of the Faculty, a three-year position beginning July 1. Candidates are McKay Coble, Professor of Design and Chair of the Department of Dramatic Art; and Arne Kalleberg, Kenan Distinguished Professor of Sociology. The faculty elections will be held April 13-20 via a survey that will be emailed to all members of the Voting Faculty.

The *University Gazette* will carry a Q&A with the candidates in its elections issue, which will come out in April 1.
