Faculty Scholars Program applications due March 23

The Carolina Women's Center is now accepting applications for the 2018-2019 Faculty Scholars Program. Three separate \$10,000 grants will be awarded to support research related to the CWC's mission of furthering gender equity. All full time faculty and part-time faculty with at least a .5FTE appointment are eligible to apply. Applicants should have at least 3 years of service to the University by the beginning of the grant. Applications open for Senior Faculty Research and Scholarly Leaves

The Provost's Office is now accepting applications for Senior Scholarly Research and Scholarly Leaves. The leaves will pay a full base salary for one semester, not exceeding \$60,000, or one-half of the base salary for the full academic year, not exceeding \$60,000. Additionally, a \$4,000 research fund will be provided during the leave. The leaves must be taken during the 2018-2019 academic year. Permanent, full-time, salaried faculty who hold a tenured, tenure track, or fixed-term position at the associate or full professor level are eligible to apply.
