




Total UNC-CH Enrollment 2006-2007 27,717 Students

All Students Receiving Any Aid 2006-2007 15,327 Students







Need-Based Aid Distributed to Students, by Type 2006-2007






Typical Financial Aid Package for Aid-Eligible Freshman Applying By March 1st 2006-2007





Need-Based Aid Distributed to All Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions




Need-Based Aid Distributed to Undergraduates, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions





Need-Based Aid Distributed to Graduate/Professional Students, by Source




Gift Aid Distributed to All Students, by Source 2006-2007, In Millions



Total Aid Distributed to All Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



Total Aid Distributed to Undergraduate Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



Total Aid Distributed to Graduate/Professional Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



Need-Based Aid Distributed to All Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



Need-Based Aid Distributed to Undergraduate Students, by Type 2006-2007, In Millions



