Resolution 2012-8. On Endorsing the Faculty Executive Committee Report on Academic Irregularities and Commending Chancellor Thorp's Actions to Restore Confidence in Carolina's Academic Integrity.

The General Faculty resolves:

The faculty of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill endorses the conclusions and recommendations of the July 26, 2012 report of the special subcommittee of the Faculty Executive Committee written in response to recent disclosures of academic irregularities involving student-athletes and others, and commends Chancellor Thorp on the actions he has taken to restore confidence in Carolina's academic integrity, specifically

- An independent review headed by Dr. James G. Martin to identify any other academic irregularities that may have occurred;
- A study headed by Dr. Hunter Rawlings of the appropriate future relationship between academics and athletics at Carolina;
- Reorganization of the Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes;
- Expansion of academic advising by adding new positions to monitor and oversee academic advising for student-athletes;
- Coordinating and clarifying the relationship between academic advising and the Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes;
- Strengthening faculty involvement in athletics;
- Strengthening the connections between the Department of Athletics and the College of Arts and Sciences; and
- New and strengthened policies in the College and Summer School designed to prevent future irregularities.
