On the Occasion of his Receiving the Degree of Doctor of Letters

ARTHUR STANLEY LINK, Professor of History at Princeton and Editor-in-Chief of the Wilson papers, Phi Beta Kappa, A.B., with highest honors in history, M.A. and Ph. D. of this university, fulfilling the bright promise of his youth as an historical scholar, teacher, lecturer, editor, and writer, has held posts in North Carolina State College and in Northwestern University, as well as Princeton. Twice awarded the Guggenheim Fellowship for advanced study, more than once honored by special lectureships in universities, he was in 1958-59 chosen for the Harmsworth Professorship at Oxford University.

Author of forty-two of numerous articles and seven books, five dealing with Wilson, Dr. Link has been twice awarded the annual Bancroft Prize for the best work in American History in recognition of the excellence of two separate volumes in his monumental biography of our great wartime President.

Recognized nationally and internationally as a leading authority on the Wilson era, Dr. Link has, by his brilliant and scholarly works in the field of history, and by his deep insight into the mind of one of the great Americans of this century, brought honor to his alma mater. It is entirely fitting that the University in which he did all his work should honor him by bestowing on him, as it did on Woodrow Wilson half a century ago, the degree of Doctor of Letters.
