BERNARD R. BERELSON is a leader in higher education, social research, and population studies. Born in Washington, he attended Whitman College, the University of Washington, and the University of Chicago. He was a student of our own Louis Round Wilson and succeeded him as Dean of the Graduate Library School at the University of Chicago. He also served as Director of the Behavioral Sciences Division of the Ford Foundation and of the Bureau of Applied Social Research at Columbia University. He is now President of The Population Council and has served as a key member of the Commission on Population Growth and the American Future. Among his numerous books and articles is a pioneering study of population policy. He has served as an important mentor for faculty and students associated with the Carolina Population Center of this University. His work has pointed the way toward the solution of some of the world's most pressing and critical problems.
