HARRY FULCHER COMER, A. B. Vanderbilt, M. A. Columbia; for over a quarter of a century Secretary of the Y. M. C. A. at this University, he was, to quote Senator Graham "one of those creative spirits who have helped to make Chapel Hill world-famous as a center of study of industrial, interracial, and international relations, always promoting good causes in the University, the community, and the state. Organizer of the Institute of Human Relations, out of which grew the Carolina Political Union, and the International Relations Club, he fostered on this campus an atmosphere of free discussion of public affairs and issues, tempered always by a spirit of democratic Christian humanitarianism.

Advocating the practical application of the principles of Jesus in modern life, he has earned a secure place in the affections of alumni and friends of this University.
