

JULIAN DERYL HART, surgeon, teacher, university president; born in Buena Vista, Georgia, in 1894; recipient of the A.B. from Emory in 1916 and the A.M. in 1917; M.D. from The Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in 1921; intern, assistant resident, resident surgeon and associate surgeon, Johns Hopkins Hospital, 1921-1930 and teacher in The Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, 1922-1930; professor and chairman of the Department of Surgery of Duke University Medical School, 1930; pioneer in the use of ultra-violet radiation for control of airborne infection in hospital operating rooms; author of numerous articles in scientific journals and member and officer of many medical societies and honorary fraternities, including Phi Beta Kappa; President of Duke University in 1960: the University of North Carolina is happy to confer the degree of Doctor of Laws upon the president of a sister institution whose teams on athletic fields challenge our keenest competition and whose achievements in the world of scholarship excite our admiration and invite our emulation.
